Dear GISC families,

With our first two full weeks behind us, I must tell you how appreciative we are of your comments, suggestions, and recommendations as we refine our processes and systems to support the very best educational environment for your children. Housekeeping, transportation, and security are all improving in some part due to your communications with us. Thank you! Please keep those lines of communication open as we continue to consider every possibility for excellence.

The last two weeks were full of active and engaging learning experiences for your children, as well as the critical gathering of baseline achievement date through the MAP assessments in Grades 2 through 8. Individual student reports will be available later in October in time for the Parent Master Class on understanding MAP data to be held on October 25. We will be setting growth targets with and for each student with expected targets met by the Spring MAP assessments in May. Based on our **admissions MAP data**, our students are achieving at higher levels than their peers in other international schools in Egypt in math and reading comprehension. However, we are seeing math achievement for entering students somewhat lower than students worldwide. The collection of valid baseline scores for all students will be invaluable in planning for the learning needs of each child.

In the month of October, we also want to launch our formal Parent Support Organization and parent volunteers. Our PRE will be sending out information on how you can be involved as a GISC advocate and/or volunteer.

Organized by our Activities Coordinator, Mr. Bayoumy, our first field trips are being planned for October to give our students real world and hands-on experiences to enhance their classroom learning. Grades 5 and 6 students will visit the new Egyptian Civilization Museum and I can personally attest that this will be an exciting expert look at thousands of years of Egyptian history.





Our KG2 students will be exploring sustainability to an Organic Farm experiencing food production and farming practices that are good for our planet.
